CODE OF CONDUCT

Our Code of Conduct is an important part of how we get our learning done.

For the 2019-2020 year there are two changes that parents need to be aware of:

1. Hats

The wearing of hats in the hall is permitted. Hoods that obscur the student's face should not be worn in the hall.

2. Cell Phones

Cell phones have become an increasing issue at our school over the last few years – both as a distraction to the learning in the classroom and as an issue on the school yard. Technology is a wonderful tool but when misused, it can put your child in danger or cause difficulties for other children (cyberbullying). The laptops and Ipads we use in the classrooms have dangerous sites blocked and we are able to control what students have access to.

It is not possible to do that with cell phones. We have amended our policy to help children learn and to keep them safe. If you feel that you want your student to have access to a cell phone before and after school, cell phones may be brought to school and left either in the student's back pack or with the teacher. If the child needs to call you at a recess or lunch break this can be done from the office.

We apologize for any inconvenience but feel that this change will make the school a safer and more effective learning environment for all students. If you would like to dialogue about this issue, please contact Ms. Percy.

HOME READING PROGRAM

Reading is an important skill for all students.

Did you know that if a child reads on book for each school night, they would read 181 books? If a child reads 1 book for every night (including weekends and holidays) they would read 365 books! Reading regularly helps develop reading skills and also increases the child's vocabulary and knowledge of many subjects. To encourage each student to read more and encourage a love of reading. Crescent Park has a Home Reading Program. Each student will bring home a Home Reading Form. Each day, please read with your child for 15 minutes. You can read to them, or they can read to you or to another person. Then you can initial that the book was read on the form. Once a child has completed a form, they can return it to their classroom teacher, claim a prize, and get the next Home Reading Form.

Thank you for participating in the Home Reading Program to help develop your child's reading skills and a love of reading.
