INSTRUCTION – GRANTING CREDITS

Description:

It is the will of the Board of Education that, where appropriate and measurable, course credits be awarded to external or equivalent school courses in recognition of achievement from an institution other than a B.C. public school.

It is also the Board's will that prior learning may be recognized and credits awarded through a challenge process.

Description:

1. The institution other than a B.C. public school must be a recognized institution. A list of External Credit and Dual Credit granting institutions is available in the *Handbook of Procedures for the Graduation Program* on the Ministry of Education website.

- 2. Challenge or equivalency course(s) must have a comprehensive curriculum deemed at least equivalent to the 80% of the public school course for which credit is sought.
- 3. Steps described in Regulation 4110 will be followed in the assignment of credit(s) to challenge or equivalency courses.
