Welcome Back!

We have finally arrived at our first week back to school. For some of you this is your first time back since before Spring Break. We are excited to see you and we have missed you. We can't wait to show you our new way of doing things. You probably already know that your school will look different on the inside and some daily routines will change. You may have specific entrances to go to, different breaks and lunch times, and you may be told that you have to stay in a certain area while using the playground. Even though things will be different, I know that you will adapt to these changes and still have fun while at school. Plus, you may even find that you like some of these new rules, because with less students on the playground, you might even get more time to spend on your favourite equipment or playing your favourite games.

You are now in a learning group or cohort. These two terms mean the same thing. This is a group of people you are going to be spending a lot of time with when you are at school. Your teacher is in your cohort and some educational assistants may be in your cohort as well. It is important that all of you go through your health check list before you come to school. If you are feeling sick, you must stay at home. This keeps everyone safe. You may have other teachers come to teach you gym, music, French, or something else, and because they are not in your cohort, they will distance from you or wear a mask. Please respect their space.

One thing you will really notice is the amount of hand sanitizer you will be putting on your hands, or the amount of times you wash your hands.
