Superintendent of Schools Report:

School/Student News

DCSS Central Campus held Employment & Career Seminars. Grade 8-9 students had the opportunity to choose from 13 different seminars and learn about the transition to high school and post-secondary education, career education programs, financial advice and gain insight on what skills & abilities are needed to attain employment. Local businesses that participated included, The Source, Dawson Creek Co-op, McDonald's, Corlane Sporting Goods, Legacy Village Market, TD Canada Trust, North Peace Credit Union along with South Peace Secondary Campus and Northern Lights College.

The Kindness Club at Tremblay held a "free hugs" day to spread kindness. The Club set up a booth and gave free hugs and handed out friendship suckers to students.

The two senior intermediate classes at Tumbler Ridge Elementary are working on giving back to the community. The groups are holding different fundraising activities, these include a cake walk, bake sale and selling hot chocolate. Funds raised are being donated to the Dawson Creek Hospital, a homeless shelter in Quesnel and to the SPCA in Dawson Creek.

Every morning at Pouce Coupe Elementary School, the teachers and several older students host a Breakfast Club. This is a great community building activity and has had a very positive impact on the learning in the school by giving the students a good start to their day. The grade 4/5/6 class has been sewing, knitting and crocheting for Applied Design, Skills and Technology.

Windrem Elementary participated in a cereal box challenge. The students were given the choice to see what they could make out of cereal boxes. The final products were displayed in a presentation of learning at the school.

Human Right's Museum Field Trip

The final request was approved for the DCSS – South Peace field trip to the Human Right's Museum in Winnipeg, Manitoba scheduled from February 25, 2019 to March 1, 2019.

2018-19 Amended Annual Budget

The 2018-19 Amended Annual Budget Bylaw was read and adopted.

2019-20 Enrolment Projections

Enrolment projections were presented to the board. School District #59 is projecting a decrease in 50 FTE for the 2019/20 school year.

Pouce Coupe School Capacity

Currently Pouce Coupe Elementary School is operating over-capacity. The district was able to work collaboratively with the Village of Pouce Coupe and the Pouce Coupe Public Library Board to temporarily convert library space into a classroom for the current school year, this allowed students to attend their catchment area school. A one classroom expansion request has been submitted to the Ministry of Education, the board is expecting an answer on this request in early March 2019. The board discussed alternative solutions if the request is not approved.
