Louis Riel was a prominent leader among Metis people and fought to protect Metis rights against the Canadian Government. He led the Red River Resistance (1869-70) and North-West rebellion (1885).



DCSS volleyball teams had a successful season. The grade 10 team placed 9th at Provincials.


DCSS students participated in activities connecting

2021-22 Graduation Rates

The Superintendent reported on the 2021-22 completion rates. The overall 6-year completion rate for SD59 was 82% which is down 3% from the previous year; the rate for Indigenous students fell 5% from 73% to 67%.
