#### Superintendent of Schools Report:

#### **School/Student News**

## **Ministry of Education and Child Care Updates**

#### **Kindergarten Registration**

Kindergarten registration will open on January 8th, 2024 at all elementary schools in the district. Children must be five years of age by December 31, 2024 to be eligible for Kindergarten registration.

## Mental Health Crisis and Suicide Prevention Helpline

There is a new national helpline specific for mental health crisis and suicide prevention. The service is accessible via call or text to 9-8-8 and is available 24/7/365 and offers trauma-informed and culturally affirming support to anyone who is thinking of suicide or who is worried about someone they know.

#### **Statement of Financial Information Report**

The Statement of Financial Information (SOFI) report is complete. The annual report is required by all public institutions and publishes the names, salaries and related expenses of employees

### New Spaces Child Care Application Update

The Secretary Treasurer informed the Board that the ChildCareBC's New Spaces Fund applications submitted last January are moving to the next phase of the approval process with the Ministry. The applications were submitted for childcare centres in Tumbler Ridge and Dawson Creek at Tremblay Elementary School.
