Superintendent of Schools Report:

School/Student News

Red and Black: The vibrant colours of EFR Bulldogs symbolize courage, determination, calmness, and kindness.

Medicine Wheel:

The Medicine Wheel's circular shape embodies the life cycle for Indigenous peoples. It is a powerful reminder that all beings—humans and nature—are interconnected, emphasizing harmony and balance in our lives.

Runner

This represents not only athletics but also honours the rich traditions of Indigenous Peoples, reflecting their enduring spirit and resilience.

Brown (Nubuck-hide) on Runner:

This earthy tone connects to the land and the significance of animal hide to Indigenous Peoples.

Eagle Feather:

A symbol of honour and respect among First Nations Peoples.



Tumbler Ridge Secondary School students have been learning about wind energy and the art students are creating many forms of pottery.

Tumbler Ridge Senior Secondary was also excited to have Tyler McGregor, a paralympic athlete speak at a school assembly on achieving goals, accessibility, and overcoming challenges. Mr. McGregor is the captain of the Canadian men's national para ice

hockey team and was in the area to participate in the announcement that Dawson Creek will host the 2025 Para Cup November 30th to December 6th, 2025 at the Ovintiv Events Centre.

How Are We Doing? Indigenous Education Report

The report considers the data for all students, students with disabilities or diverse abilities and Indigenous students, and helps to identify areas for intervention.

2025-2026 School Calendar

The Board of Education adopted the 2025-2026 School Calendar. The calendar is available on the school district website: 2025-2026 School Calendar | School District 59.

Reports from the Secretary-Treasurer:

2024-2025 Amended Annual Budget Amendment

The Board of Education adopted a revised 2024-2025 Amended Budget with a total bylaw amount of \$68,817,590. The three changes included recording the Literacy Professional Learning Grant as a Special Purpose Grant; allocation of additional funding from the Ministry Funding Re-calculation; and the treatment of capital projects in the capital schedule.

2025-2026 Annual Budget

The Secretary Treasurer presented the first draft of the 2025-2026 Annual Budget. The Board adopted the first reading of the bylaw in the amount of \$67,864,605. Part of the budget development included a survey that had over 200 responses. The Board will be hosting a consultation meeting on April 2, 2025 to receive further feedback from stakeholders.

Capital Projects Update

Crescent Park Elementary School Expansion

Since the last board meeting, Fort Modular, Force Engineering and SD59 project team met to discuss project timelines, building permits and interior finishes. A further consultants meeting was held to discuss and finalize structural, mechanical and electrical details in preparation for manufacturing.

<u>Dawson Creek and Tumbler Ridge Child Care Facilities</u>

The architect continues to wait for the modular build estimates for both centres. The Secretary-Treasurer has escalated the timeline concern with the architect. The budget remains unchanged from February 19, 2025.

with Board Chairs, Superintendents and Secretary Treasures where the Ministry provided information on new initiatives and updates.

Dawson Creek Council met at the end of February and reviewed the How are We Doing? Report. Council will not be meeting in March due to Spring Break.

Trustee Hillton reported the Chetwynd Indigenous Council meeting on March 11, 2025 was held at Saulteau First Nations and the meeting ended with a tour of the First Nations new cultural centre.
