




Peace View Elementary School recently adopted the motto: "One for All, and All for One." The students are really working together as a team with acts of cooperation and kindness.



Little Prairie Elementary recently unveiled a stunning winter mural—an inspiring celebration of community, culture, and creativity. The winter nightscape captures the powerful beauty of our northern landscape. The mural is more than just a painting - it honours the culture, stories, and wisdom of Indigenous communities who have long cared for this land. It connects students to their environment and to the traditions that shaped the place they proudly live in. It reminds all who walk past it, that art is a living, breathing part of our shared history.





Tumbler Ridge Elementary co-created a piece of artwork with the Tumbler Ridge Visitor Centre that was displayed on World Art Day (April 15th). A grade 5/6 class at TRE built earthquake proof building models that were tested by Mrs. Edwards, the school Principal. The school held a Build a Bus campaign - over \$14,000 was raised for student field trips!

Truth and Reconciliation District Day

The District's Truth and Reconciliation focused learning day was a powerful day that brought together staff from across the district to learn and understand their own journey through Truth and Reconciliation. Kevin Lamoureux and Madelaine McCallum were guest speakers that shared their own personal stories of



tragedy, learning, understanding, growing, and finding their own personal strength.



The student presentation, "Say Her Name" was a powerful movement honouring loved ones lost to the ongoing crisis of MMIWG2S.

The profound day

ended with a round dance drummed by members of Saulteau First Nations and closing remarks by West Moberly First Nations.

Thank-you to students at TRSS for making the MMIWG2S buttons to recognize May 5th as 'Red Dress Day' allowing staff to recognize and honour the lives and legacies of those lost.



PreVenture Program

PreVenture is an evidence-based program that teaches students how to cope with stress, handle peer pressure, and make positive choices. It is designed for implementation for students in between grades 7-9. The program provides students with the tools they need to avoid substance misuse and improve their overall well-being.

In addition to the PreVenture program, the district is participating in the Open Parachute program - a mental health program used to support the emotional well-being and resilience of students from Kindergarten to grade 12. The program is for all students and is used as part of a regular classroom learning and contributes to creating a safe, caring school environment where every student feels supported.

Reports from the Secretary-Treasurer:

2026-2027 Five Year Annual Capital Plan - Draft

The Secretary Treasurer presented a draft of the Five-Year Annual Capital Plan to the board. The plan includes major and minor capital project requests that are submitted to the Ministry for consideration. The draft plan can be viewed in the <u>May board meeting package</u>.

A final copy of the major capital will be presented to the Board in June for approval. The minor capital submission will be presented in the September board meeting.

Capital Projects Update

The following updates on the Capital Projects was reported:

Crescent Park Elementary School Expansion

Since April 28, 2025 the following have occurred:

- City issued building permit for modular portion of project.
- o Fort Modular confirmed manufacturing of modular sections will begin June 2, 2025.
- Force Engineering to provide documentation to post second tender for civil works on BC Bid May 21,2025.
- Director of Operations and Secretary-Treasurer met with Crescent Park PAC to provide an update on the project.
- Director of Operations contacted the City to provide notice that civil drawings will be forwarded May 22 and to request dedicated time to review them.

Dawson Creek and Tumbler Ridge Child Care Facilities

Since April 28, 2025 the following have occurred:

- o Decision made to proceed with the stick build option for the following reasons:
 - Streamlined process with 1 contractor, 1 tender, 1 building permit.
 - Schedule.
 - Class D Refined Modular will only become more expensive as the costing (Class C, B, A) is more refined thus shrinking the variances of cost of stick build to modular (4.5%-2.1%).
 - Recent challenging experience with Crescent Park Elementary Expansion: 2 tenders, 2 contractors, 3 building permits (third is sprinklers).
 - Increased cost will be requested and assumed funded from Ministry of Education and Child Care.
 - Ministry does not have a preference between stick build or modular.
- SD 59 project team met to discuss next steps.
- Architect sent Class A cost estimates for the stick build childcares. School District
 59 will reach out to the Ministry to see about applying for more funding.
- The district will present 2 options for the Dawson Creek Childcare Facility to the ministry:
 - Option 1 without before and after childcare (original application)
 - Option 2 with before and after childcare (increased cost)

Committee Reports:


Indigenous Education Councils
