




Students are enjoying school sports across the District!

Final Enrolment

The Secretary-Treasurer presented the final enrolment count as of September 30, 2024. There was a slight increase from the enrolment reported in the September board meeting; however,

the District had overall decrease of 44.9 FTE from projections submitted in the spring. The District is down 48.7 FTE since September 2023.
