There will be a scheduled time for when parents and the public can share their input with the district and I will keep parents fully informed regarding the dates of these upcoming meetings. CLASSROOM NEWS!

<u>Kindergarten:</u> The kindergarten class has been working on getting settled into our daily routines and getting to know each other. We are learning to print letters and numbers and are enjoying the different learning activities.

<u>Grade 1/2:</u> This term we are focusing on letter and number formation, word spacing and using available words (i.e. words they see in texts) in written responses. We are working with word families and will be starting the Words Their Way spelling program. This system helps students to use spelling patterns in order to gain confidence in spelling new words independently. Grade 2 students will build beginning skills in alphabetization in order to use a word list book for independent writing. Students will be using theses sills in their descriptive writing tasks. Students are gaining skills in recognizing number sets automatically and in recalling addition and subtraction math facts easily. Students have begun a Science unit on water cycle and water sources and have begun to form hypotheses during experiments. In music we are using rhythm and call and response in singing. Our physical education activities are focused on team focus, coordination and safety.

<u>Grade 3/4:</u> Mrs. Pohl's class will be collecting recycling bottles and cans in an effort to raise money for an orphanage in Haiti. Their class is celebrating 'kindness' and thinking about ideas to spread kindness in their classroom, school, community and the world. <u>Grade 4/5:</u> Hello everyone! My name is Zhanna Yushchanka (Mrs. Clark), it is a great pleasure to be here at Don Titus Montessori school. As the grade 4/5 teacher I am looking forward to getting know the students, their parents, and my fellow teachers. I believe this school year will be very interesting and exciting! A couple words about myself, before I came to Canada I graduated Gomel State University, Belarus, worked as a teacher at a secondary school. I would say travelling and reading are my top interests.

Grade 5/6/7: Mr. Conrad - The beginning of this school year has been very exciting and positive for us in the intermediate class. We have started doing science experiments with flight. Students are working hard to review the scientific methods and learn the steps to conducting experiments. We are working on accuracy while measuring and recording. Data. We have also started learning basic musical theory and doing some singing. We look forward to performing some songs in the near future once we have got more practice in. Mrs. B – We had a fantastic trip to Gwillim. We were a bit chilly, but we had a blast. It was a great opportunity for the students to get to know each other and we have started to create a safe, caring class community. We have been practicing class meetings where the students can voice their concerns and brainstorm ways of solving their issues. We are busy fundraising for our upcoming field trips, such a s swimming and curling. We also have been hard at work on Math, Reading and Writing. The students have been learning how to dress up their paragraph writing and already they have drastically improved their writing.
