Program Overview

Fun in French for kids aged 4 to 16!



PRE-KINDERGARTEN

The Pre-Kindergarten program is available for children going into Kindergarten in French Immersion or Francophone programs immediately after summer.



REGULAR PROGRAM

Children who have completed Kindergarten to Grade 6 in French Immersion or Francophone programs participate in our Regular program. They are organized into groups according to age. Activities take place primarily on site.



LES AVENTURIERS

Teens who have completed Grades 7 or 8 in French Immersion or Francophone programs can join Les Aventuriers for overnight hiking, biking, or canoe trips.



LE GROUPE MÉLI-MÉLO

Teens who have completed Grade 7 in French Immersion or Francophone programs can join the energetic Groupe Méli-Mélo for games, skits and artistic adventure.



LES COUREURS DES BOIS

Teens who have completed Grade 9 or up in French Immersion or Francophone programs can participate in Les Coureurs des bois for overnight hiking, biking, or canoe trips.



FORMATION DES LEADERS ADOLESCENT

This one week leadership program provides training and experience in being a camp counselor. Open to teens that have completed Grade 10 and up in French Immersion or Francophone programs.

BCFFC is a French-centered, high energy, activity-oriented family summer camp.

Families camp for one week in their own campsite in one of three campgrounds located throughout BC: During July, the camp is near Salmon Arm, on the shores of beautiful Shuswap Lake. Then the camp moves to northerneastern BC at Gwillim Lake, near Chetwynd, for a week. The final two weeks of camp take place in mid-August on Vancouver Island, near Nanaimo. The activities at each location focus on local climate and geography. Depending on the site, these activities can include swimming and water play, canoeing, kayaking, hiking, nature study, orienteering, archery, singing, games, arts and crafts, and a sleep-out under the stars (weather permitting!).

Note: All programs offered may not be exactly as specified. Programs are unique to each camp location and may be adjusted to suit weather conditions and the fitness level of the participants. Programs may be cancelled or blended due to insufficient registration numbers.

Established in 1983, BCFFC is a non-profit society dedicated to encouraging children to use the French language and learn about French Canadian culture in an outdoor setting.

Our university-age, francophone summer staff (fes moniteurs) share their language and culture with the children and model the use of the French language in a fun and caring atmosphere.



Your children work hard all year to master their French language skills; BCFFC provides a fun, safe and unique opportunity to carry these abilities beyond the classroom.
